The History of the Gratz Park Inn

Construction of the building began in 1916 for Dr. Waller O Bullock, Dr. David Woolfold Barrow, and Dr. Barrow's father, Dr. David Barrow. Inspired by the May Clinic, the three doctors opened a joint practice. They commissioned Frankel and Curtis of Lexington to construct the colonial revival two-story Upper Street front and matching one-story Second Street wing.

The practice grew with people bringing aches, pains, and even

detonator caps to the doctors. In 1920, nine



doctors, including the original three, founded the Lexington Clinic. The institution enlarged the wing on Second Street and added other rooms. Many curious things occurred at the Lexington Clinic in those days. One legend claims that the stoic moonshine distiller hurt himself running downhill to escape a revenuer. He tripped, fell and had a stick that got lodged in his eye... Fifteen years later, on a trip to Lexington; a clinic doctor removed the stick.

After the Lexington Clinic moved to Harrodsburg Road in 1958, the Fuller Engineering firm occupied the building. When Fuller Engineering moved out in 1976, the building sat vacant until 1987.

In 1987, renovation began on what now serves as the Gratz Park Inn. Gutting the building literally turned it around. Guests can now reach the hotel lobby from a private parking lot, surrounded by blooming gardens of Second Street. The Inn also had an additional level added, creating a three-story intimate hotel.
